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1. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Bobbie Jo Kelly, Chair.
2. The Oath of Office and the Statement of Appointed Officer was administered by Dianne Zachary to newly appointed member, Jerome Grossie.
3. A quorum was present.

City Manager Lynda Humble informed the seniors that all issues that have come forward from the inception of the Senior Advisory Board in November 2007 have been compiled into the attached spreadsheet and comments added to reflect what actions have been taken to answer these concerns and create closure.

**SENIOR FACILITY REVIEW**

Staffing multiple facilities for senior programs could cost \$45,000 to staff. The RCC is ideal at this point for these purposes, since the need has not been grown.

- A long term solution may be an elevator for the RCC that may be obtained through a grant.
- We need to grow the senior participation in programs.
- Room C works. There needs to be consistency in the programming so people will know where it will be.
- Budget should be a regular agenda item every month for update by Heath. Heath can be prepared on a monthly basis to address budgetary questions.

## SENIOR ATTENDANCE & USEAGE REPORTS

The City Manager would like to put together a year long program through the RCC and be committed to it. Attendance will be tracked and evaluated to see if we need to try something else. We've moved from one thing to another to accommodate seniors, but we need to be sure we are offering programs that will best meet their needs.

Staff will work with a senior communication committee to put together a survey to all seniors that qualify for a homestead exemption. Sample question:

- What would it take for you to participate in a senior program?
- What kind of programs would you like to see? The Program Committee will work with Sandy and Heath so that we can grow senior programs logically. Oct-Dec will be the test ground.
- How would you like to be communicated with?
- If we have the program, will you come?

A city-wide survey will be conducted in the fall 2009.

Seniors seem to be more interested in fitness program. We can look at senior time at the Wet Zone, but the program offered must be self-supporting. We are trying to leverage everything we can, given the economic times. You may get information about the Wet Zone at [www.WetZoneWaterpark.com](http://www.WetZoneWaterpark.com).

Lynda assured the seniors that this is not the ending spot...it is the starting spot. We have identified problems and are working on them. RCC staff has had additional customer service training. Their hearts are in the right place, but we are all human. They appreciate seniors and take you seriously. We are at a place that we need to build on what we have.

5. The minutes from the meeting of June 15, 2009 were unanimously approved after a motion by Bobbie Jo Kelly that was seconded by Susan Turek.
6. Staff updates by Heath Olinger -
  - a. Meals-on-Wheels program update - Not enough people have signed up to offer the program. Today's session was cancelled.
  - b. Volunteer opportunities - The survey for seniors should detail what types of jobs are available for volunteers.
  - c. Status of Senior Resource List - Handed out to SAB today and will be distributed throughout the city to businesses and city department.
7. Bobbie Jo announced fall computer classes for seniors at the library will be one class per month as follows:
  - a. Basic Computer September
  - b. Email in October
  - c. Microsoft Word in November

8. Susan Turek gave the report from the subcommittee on Potential Grants for Senior Centers.

Sufficient funds have been raised to apply for 501C3 status for the new non-profit senior group. Jeff Sheldon and Susan will be responsible for initiating that process. There will be a meeting on July 21<sup>st</sup> at 9:30am in Room C at the Community Centre for the election of officers: President, VP, Secretary and Treasurer. They voted in a temporary board at a July 10<sup>th</sup> breakfast meeting. A contest for new name for seniors will be held. They hope to have a community outreach for seniors through the 501c3 organization. Donna Huerta sent out an email blast.

9. This item was tabled.


10. Public Announcement. Members of the Board and/or staff may make announcements of local civic events. No member of the board or commission may discuss or take any action with regard to the announcements

**Senior Housing Sub-Committee Report**  
**July 20, 2009**

In order for the sub-committee to recommend a type or types of retirement facility for the City of Rowlett, the following housing options will be addressed in its report:

**Senior Housing Options:**

**Aging in Place** – Seniors resist relocating or moving for any number of reasons. Attachment to their home, comfort of their home, their neighbors, their neighborhood, their church, shopping convenience and family located nearby, to mention a few. In order to remain in their homes some have executed a reverse mortgage. Reverse mortgages are increasing in popularity with seniors who have equity in their homes and want to supplement their income. The only reverse mortgage insured by the U.S. Federal Government is called a Home Equity Conversion Mortgage or HECM, and is only available through an FHA approved lender. More information can be found online at the Hud web site.

**Relocating** – In many cases, the decision to relocate can be difficult depending on physical circumstances. Generally, seniors in good health will explore relocation options when home upkeep and maintenance become issues to them. Other considerations might be that the neighborhood has deteriorated and safety has become a concern, they want to be near their children (70% of those 65 or over live within 1 hour of a sibling), climbing stairs in their two story home has become a problem, house is too big so downsizing is desired, a large portion of their assets are tied up in the home and cash for living expenses becomes a priority, retired and looking for a new lifestyle and the inability to drive an automobile any longer.

**Relocating Options:**

Age Restricted or "Retirement Communities" – These facilities can be like any other neighborhood except that they are restricted to people usually 55 or over, or 62 and over. Although no longer required by law to be competitive and attractive to a retirement lifestyle, age restricted communities are continuing to offer amenities, activities and services that cater to residents.

"Seniors Only" Apartments – Some older seniors sell their homes and move to an apartment. This frees up equity that can then supplement income through interest or dividends earned through investment of the capital. The move also frees seniors from home maintenance and grounds-keeper chores. For others living in a large complex of all seniors also affords a greater sense of security than living in a private home.

Modular Home Communities - Modular Home Communities have full time part year residents. Part time residents may be "snowbirds" coming for three months or so. The lots and the mobile units (which are not really very mobile) may be leased to, or owned by, the residents.

A special thanks to Ben White for his interest and assistance. Through his efforts we were able to attend a meeting with owner/operator Ken Mitchell of the Country Lane Senior Campus in McKinney on Friday, June 17<sup>th</sup>. We were given the opportunity to visit the facility and get answers to important questions.

The submission of the sub-committee's final report is planned for the August 2009 Senior Advisory Board meeting.

## Senior Facility Review

Location	Review
Fire Station #1	This location is structurally sound; however, the inside is not habitable for a public facility. The restrooms are not ADA compliant and would need to be modified. Using this facility for a senior center, would change the use of the property and require the City add additional parking per our parking standards. This would cost over \$100,000, which is not a recommended use of funds for an interim facility. Additionally, this is not the highest and best use for downtown development.
House on Skyline Drive	The foundation for the home is in disrepair and the structure is not structurally sound for a public facility. The house does not have parking and it is not ADA compliant.
Historical Society	This is an ideal facility for senior accessibility. There is an ADA restroom, ramps to the building, and a large kitchen. However, the facility does not have multiple rooms for all of Rowlett's senior programming; therefore, several programs would continue to be held at the Community Centre, which is a duplication of staff's effort. Also, there would be an ongoing operational cost of +/- \$45,000 for staffing the facility and additional supplies/utilities.
Coyle House	This facility will need to be brought into compliance with ADA standards and there is not a sufficient public restroom facility in the building. Additionally, the house is not in a suitable condition for a public facility and will need funding for improvements. This facility is not ready for immediate use. Also, this facility is better positioned for a visitor's center and/or a historical/museum location.
Community Centre	This is currently the location for recreational senior programming. The facility is ADA compliant, but not "senior friendly." The senior community desires a "dedicated" senior space. Since the Community Centre rents out the upstairs rooms, the only dedicated room option is Room E, which is downstairs and difficult to access. The Community Centre allows for multiple senior programming and utilizes existing staff, utilities, and other resources.

### Short-term Solution:

#### The City will make the following improvements this summer:

- 1) Add a handrail from the parking lot to the front doors at the Community Centre. (\$15,191)
- 2) Add an automatic door into the Community Centre. (\$6,994)

#### Staff will research:

- 1) The City will purchase 4-5 electric carts to be stationed in the parking lots and used by seniors to get from the parking lot and for mobility around the Centre. (\$5,000)

\*\*The upstairs rooms at the Community Centre will continue to be used for senior programming, such as bridge, potlucks, etc.

### Long-term Solution:

- 1) Over the next year, the City will evaluate and additional of an elevator at the Community Centre. Additionally, City staff will work with a citizen who has offered to assist in seeking grant funding for this project.
