- 7B.** Consider action to approve a resolution for continued annual maintenance payments to a software vendor, as provided in the annual Information Technology budget, and authorizing the City Manager to execute the necessary documents to continue said services.

- 7C.** Consider action to approve a resolution approving a purchase order to the City's data storage vendor in an amount not to exceed \$60,000.

- 7F.** Consider action to approve a resolution executing an Advanced Funding Agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) for the purpose of accessing federal transportation grant funding for the design and construction of sidewalks along Miller Road and Chiesa Road, and authorizing the Mayor to execute the necessary documents.

This item was approved as RES-087-19 on the Consent Agenda.

- 7G.** Consider a resolution approving a renewal with United Concordia for dental coverage and Mutual of Omaha for Basic Life/AD&D, Voluntary Life/AD&D, Voluntary Short Term Disability and Long Term Disability per RFP #2019-10.

Passed the Consent Agenda

A motion was made by Councilmember Margolis, seconded by Councilmember Sherrill, including all the preceding items marked as having been approved on the Consent Agenda. The motion carried with an unanimous vote of those members present.

8. ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

- 8A. Consider all matters incident and related to the issuance and sale of “City of Rowlett, Texas General Obligation Bonds, Series 2019, City of Rowlett Tax Notes, Series 2019, and City of Rowlett Waterworks and Sewer System Revenue Bonds, Series 2019,” including the adoption of Ordinances authorizing the issuance of such bonds and approving all other matters incident thereto.

Wendy Badgett, Director of Financial Services, gave a brief presentation regarding this item. She stated the City of Rowlett Tax Notes, Series 2019 did not sell; however, the Tax Notes will go out in the near future for a competitive bank bid and will be brought back before the City Council at the August 6, 2019 Council meeting.

This item was split into two votes as follows:

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Brown, seconded by Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Grubisich to approve the items for the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2019 as presented. The motion carried with an unanimous vote of those members present. This item was approved as ORD-015-19.

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Brown, seconded by Councilmember Bell to approve the items for the Waterworkds and Sewer System Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 as presented. The motion carried with an unanimous vote of those members present. This item was approved as ORD-016-19.

- 8B.** Conduct a public hearing and consider action on an amendment to Chapter 77-704 of the Rowlett Development Code (RDC) to implement Section 211.006(f) of the Texas Local Government Code, providing a standard requiring a three-fourths majority vote of the City Council to grant a change in zoning district boundary following a recommendation of denial from a three-fourths majority vote of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Munal Mauladad, Director of Community Development, presented the information for this item. The public hearing opened and closed at 8:43 p.m. with no speakers.

A motion was made by Councilmember Margolis, seconded by Councilmember Sherrill, to approve the item as presented. The motion carried with a unanimous vote of those members present. This item was approved as ORD-018-19.
