8A. Conduct a public hearing and take action on a request by Rogelio Martinez, Colimas Company, on behalf of property owner Carla J. Adams, for a Special Use Permit (SUP)

for an accessory building on property zoned Single-Family Residential (SF-8) District. The 0.50-acre site is bounded by Dalrock Road, Quail Ridge Drive, and Quail Creek Drive, in the City of Rowlett, Dallas County, Texas.
