- 2A.** The City Council shall convene into Executive Session pursuant to the Texas Government Code, §551.071 (Consultation with Attorney) and §551.087 (Economic Development), to discuss commercial or financial information and the offer of incentives to business prospects that the City may seek to have locate, stay or expand in Rowlett and with which the City is conducting economic development negotiations and to receive legal advice from the city attorney regarding the request for a private letter ruling from the Texas Comptroller's Office and the Public Improvement District's Service Assessment Plan for the Sapphire Bay development project. Brian Funderburk, City Manager, provided the update.

- 3B.** Receive a presentation and discuss proposed substantial amendments related to the City's Community Development Block Grant Programs. (30 minutes)

Munal Mauladad, Director of Community Development, reviewed the current and proposed allocation per the annual plan and the potential sidewalk/alley/park projects.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of Council to proceed with the parks items and include Carson Court if there are remaining funds available.

7A. Approving minutes.

7B. Consider a resolution authorizing an expenditure for food pantry assistance.

Consider action to approve a resolution authorizing the expenditure of \$34,500 to provide food pantry assistance to Life Message Inc. in support of continuing community-wide COVID-19 related operations.

This item was approved on the Consent Agenda as RES-149-20.

7C. Consider a resolution accepting a project proposal and reimbursement of project cost for enhancement project.

Consider action to approve a resolution accepting a project proposal from the Hope in Hand Food Pantry for a COVID-19 related food pantry enhancement project and authorizing the expenditure of \$14,015.97 for the reimbursement of project costs.

This item was approved on the Consent Agenda as RES-150-20.

7D. Consider a resolution authorizing the execution of an Escrow Agreement with Savannah at Lakeview Holdings, LLC.

Consider action to approve a resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute an Escrow Agreement between the City of Rowlett, Texas, and Savannah at Lakeview Holdings, LLC, in the amount of \$89,000.00 as financial guaranty to secure the installation of public improvements to serve the Lakeview Senior Living multifamily development.

This item was approved on the Consent Agenda as RES-151-20.

8A. Conduct a public hearing and adopt an ordinance on a request by Anthony Shane Tharp for the approval of a Special Use Permit to allow for an accessory structure exceeding 500 square-feet on property zoned Single Family Residential (SF-10) District. The 0.55-acre site is located

approximately 345 feet west of the intersection of Lakeview Circle and Mark Lane, in the City of Rowlett, Dallas County, Texas.

Ms. Mauladad presented the information for this item. The public hearing opened and closed with no speakers.




TAKE ANY NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE ACTION ON CLOSED/EXECUTIVE SESSION MATTERS
