



2017 Landfill Pass Information

Rowlett residents will be allowed to dispose of debris, without charge, twice within a calendar year at the Hinton Landfill and Transfer Station located in Garland by obtaining a "Landfill Pass" from the City of Rowlett.

- Resident must present a **valid driver's license and current water bill** at Utility Billing (4004 Main St.), City Secretary's office (4000 Main St.) or Public Works (4310 Industrial St.).
- Landfill Pass will then be issued to the resident and recorded.
- Only one "Landfill Pass" will be issued to a resident within a calendar year.
- When using the Landfill Pass, the resident must present their driver's license and current water bill.
- When the Landfill Pass is used for the second time, it will be surrendered by the resident and retained by the Hinton Landfill or Transfer Station staff.
- Restrictions for the Landfill Pass are as follows:
 - Non-transferable.
 - Card must be surrendered after the second use.
 - All Landfill regulations will apply.
 - Proper ID is required (both driver's license and current water bill).
 - Abused, mutilated or suspected false passes will not be honored.
 - If lost or stolen, it will not be replaced.
- The Hinton Landfill will charge Rowlett residents the following gate rate when the Landfill Pass is used up:
 - \$35.00 per ton for an automated/powered dumping vehicle;
 - \$52.50 per ton if the load is unloaded manually.
 - **\$20.00 fee for loads that are not secured with a tarp.**
- The Transfer Station will charge Rowlett residents the following gate rate when the Landfill Pass is used up:
 - \$52.50 per ton if the load is unloaded manually.
 - **\$20.00 fee for loads that are not secured with a tarp.**
- The Landfill Staff will determine if the load is commercial or residential.
- The Landfill Pass will expire December 31, 2017.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Liquids
Tires
Motor-Driven Vehicles
Fuel tanks, used oil filters or other devices that use to contain petroleum-based compounds such as gasoline, fuel oil, hydraulic fluid, lubricants or other chemicals
Debris from non-hazardous chemical spills
Friable Asbestos
Sandblast grit and non-liquid paint wastes
Infectious or hospital waste
High-pH and low-pH materials
Spent filter media residue
Hazardous Waste
Lead Acid Batteries
Pesticides or other home use chemicals
Items containing chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs)
Commercial loads of electronics, including televisions, office machines and computer equipment
Refrigerators, air conditioners, or any item containing Freon
Closed drums and PCB Waste

Cardboard
Scrap Metal & Aluminum
Auto and truck batteries
Used motor oil and transmission fluid (no antifreeze or hydraulic fluid)
Used oil filters
Kitchen grease, fat, and oil
Large Household Appliances

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Household hazardous
Electronic equipment such as televisions and computers
Tires
Used antifreeze
Plastic toys
Rubber hoses
Plastic bags, plastic cleaner bags
Polystyrene, including packing materials, bubble wrap, Styrofoam cups, food clamshells, egg cartons, and meat trays labeled #6

Notice to Transfer Station Patrons

Tarping Requirements

All loads hauled to the Transfer Station, Hinton Landfill or Wood Waste Recycling facility must be secured or covered in order to minimize litter along the route to the site, and to ensure compliance with the City Code of Ordinance and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) rules and regulations. Litter is not only unsightly and costly; it can also cause unsafe traveling conditions for other drivers.

Effective on July 2017, the Environmental Waste Services Department will start charging a \$20.00 penalty for unsecured or uncovered loads brought to any of the aforementioned facilities, and acceptance of such loads will be refused. Tarps will be available for patrons to purchase for a price of \$10.00 plus state sales tax.

Enforcement of Rules and Regulations for Compliance

- Penalty charge of \$20.00.
- Sales of 8' X 10' tarps with 190' of jute twine for \$10.00 plus sales tax.
- Environmental Waste Services Department reserves the right to refuse citizens/customer access to the City facilities for failure or refusal to pay the penalty charge and/or secure or tarp their load.
