

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT PROGRAM PROJECT UPDATE

Primrose Lane Reconstruction Project

Project Scope: Rebuilding of Primrose Lane including sidewalks, curbs and drainage systems.

Project Status:

Contractor completed construction of the storm drain inlets at Primrose Lane and Rowlett Road. Lime slurry was mixed into the native soil and a lime series testing was completed on Tuesday of this week. Area was cut to final grade and compacted along with forms and rebar set in preparation to pour concrete.

Dalrock Estates Reconstruction Project

Project Scope:

Rebuilding of Dalrock Estates Phase I includes replacing Woodside Road and portions of Chesham Drive and Highgate Lane. Storm drainage, water and sewer lines will be repaired or replaced; widen sidewalks, trees and decorative street lights will be installed.




Woodside Rd. CLOSED 9am - 3pm



CPR Class - Saturday, January 20

Standard First Aid/CPR Class Saturday, January 20 8:30am - 12:30pm @ Rowlett Community Centre Cost - \$30 Rowlett Fire Rescue sponsors the American Heart Association Standard First Aid/CPR class, which is open to anyone 16 years or older. Classes are limited to 12 students, who will receive a book and a two-year course completion card. Call 972.412.6230 for more information or to register.

The <u>Rowlett Citizen Corps Council</u> (RCCC) will sponsor a two-day Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) class on Saturday, February 3rd and 10th, 8am-5pm. During a natural or man-made disaster, CERT teams assist Public Safety teams in performing damage assessment, accounting for residents and securing quick, accessible routes into their neighborhood. CERT teams also help search for missing persons, and assist with evacuations, traffic control, courtesy patrols and at City events.



RCCC is actively recruiting residents to be trained in the CERT program that includes Disaster Medical Operations, Light Search and Rescue, and Fire Suppression following FEMA guidelines. PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

Annual Concrete Repair and Maintenance of Streets and Alleys

Cam-Crete Contracting, INC. started the concrete panel replacement repairs on Rowlett Road. They will be working on street panel removal this week, and are getting the locations ready for concrete. The first section of repairs is between Big A Road and Beech Street headed northbound in the outside lane.





Annual Contract for Concrete Sidewalk, Curb, and Gutters

F and F Concrete Inc. continues work on street, curb & gutter, sidewalk improvement repairs on Main Street.

**Work will occur between 9am and 5pm however two-way travel will remain possible with detours in the downtown area. **





Historic Water Tank Refurbish

Sandblasting started on the Main Street Historic Tank. The contractor completely enclosed the tower with tarps to limit materials from leaving the job site. Three quarters of the bowl and standpipe have been primed to this point.







Traffic Signal at Liberty Grove Road and Chiesa Road

Durable Specialties started ground work for the traffic signal. They are drilling the shafts for the pole foundations and boring conduit underneath Liberty Grove Road and Chiesa Road.



Merritt Road Ground Storage Tank

Utilities Crew completed their final visual inspection on the 2-million-gallon ground storage tank at the Merritt Road Pump Station in preparation for filling after repairs were performed by a contractor. Once disinfected, the tank can be filled and put back in to service.
