

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT PROGRAM (CIP) PROJECT UPDATE

Primrose Lane Reconstruction Project

Project Scope:

Rebuilding of Primrose Lane including sidewalks, curbs and drainage systems.

Project Status:

Recent weather continues to hamper progress on finishing the punch list for this project. (no pictures)

Dalrock Estates Reconstruction Project - Phase 1

Project Scope:

Rebuilding of Dalrock Estates Phase I includes replacing Woodside Rd. and portions of Chesham Dr. and Highgate Ln. Storm drainage, water and sewer lines will be repaired or replaced; widen sidewalks, trees and decorative street lights will be installed.



Quality Excavation continues eastward with the south side of Woodside Rd. The weather has slowed construction however approximately 800 feet of concrete has been poured. (pics 1 & 2)

Highland Meadows Reconstruction Project - Phase 1 Project Scope:

Rebuilding of the streets, sidewalks, curbs, drainage systems, street trees and lighting on Miami Dr., Vernon Dr. and Vagas Dr.

Project Status:

Existing manhole #8 is being removed this week; progress is slow due to rain. (pics 3 & 4)

Paddle Point Park Project




Reminder – a <u>photo ID is now required to vote in Texas</u>. Information is posted on the City's website.



PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

Annual Concrete Repair and Maintenance of Streets and Alleys

Cam-Crete Contracting, Inc. was delayed by the recent rain. They will resume operations on Killarney Dr. and Rowlett Rd. at the beginning of next week, weather permitting.



Annual Foam Injection Pavement Leveling

Nortex Concrete Inc. is foam injecting low areas in streets in the Westwood Shores Phase 2 and Waterview Phase 5A sub-divisions where standing water gathers. Preventative maintenance allows the City of Rowlett to "Keep the Good Streets Good".





Traffic Signal at Liberty Grove Road and Chiesa Road

Durable Specialties started assembling and mounting the mast arms for the signal. The control panel wiring, installing the lighting and setting up the video system should be finished today.





Toler Bay 2 Lift Station Upgrade Project

Contractor Felix Construction completed demolition of the existing lift station floor. Contractor has exposed the existing force main in preparation to remove and replace pipe and install a new bypass connection.



Historic Tank Refurbish

The downtown historic tank progression is slow due to the rain over the past weeks.



Annual Concrete Sidewalk, Curb, Gutter and Utility Repair Maintenance

Public Works is in the process of securing a new vendor for the program. Currently we have 54 requests for 50/50 sidewalk repairs.
